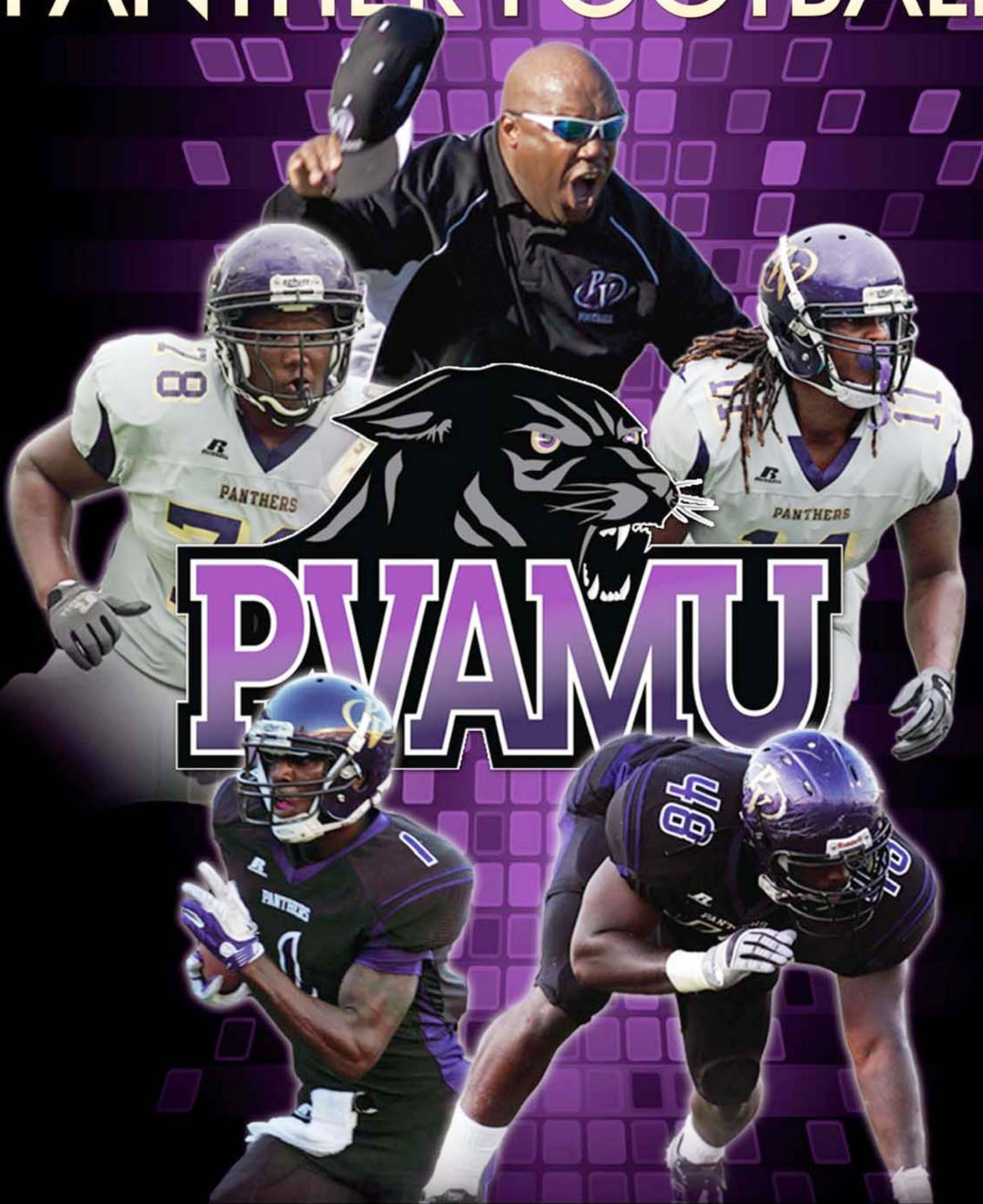

HAMILTON MAKES IT THREE STRAIGHT

Former Prairie View A&M defensive end **Adrian Hamilton** won't have far to travel as he begins his professional football career as a member of the NFL's Dallas Cowboys. This marks the third consecutive defensive end to earn a NFL Training Camp invite under defensive line coach **Miles Brandon**.

Hamilton inked a free agent deal with the Cowboys immediately following the NFL Draft and returns to his hometown for his NFL Career. Having the opportunity to play for the organization he idolized as a child will be 'a dream come true' for the Dallas native.

"I grew up watching **Emmitt Smith**, **Michael Irvin** and most recently **DeMarcus Ware**," said Hamilton. "I'm grateful for the chance to become a Cowboy and I'm preparing myself mentally and physically so I can live out this dream."

Hamilton, who played at Dallas Carter High School, had several teams requesting his services but ultimately chose Dallas due to a need at his position. With the Cowboys employing a 3-4 scheme, Hamilton will move to linebacker after a historic career as a defensive end at Prairie View A&M.

"Dallas is the perfect place for me as they had a couple of spots available at my position," said Hamilton. "I liked (defensive coordinator) **Rob Ryan** and their coaching staff when I went on my visit and I expressed to them how I wanted be apart of their organization."

NORTHERN, PEARSON TO PARTICIPATE IN NFL TRAINING CAMPS THIS SUMMER

A pair of Prairie View A&M coaches will rub elbows with some of the top athletes and coaches in the their profession as defensive line assistant **Gabe Northern** and offensive line coach **Prince Pearson** will intern with a pair of NFL organizations during their training camps.

Both coaches were selected to be apart of the Bill Walsh Minority Fellowship which is designed to expose talented minority college coaches to the methods and philosophies of NFL training camps. Northern will return to the birthplace of his NFL career in Buffalo with the Buffalo Bills while Pearson returns the state where he played collegiately at in the Minnesota Vikings.

A second round draft pick of the Buffalo Bills in 1996, Northern is a five-year NFL veteran who has spent time with the Bills, Pittsburgh Steelers and Minnesota Vikings. A graduate of LSU, Northern has coached on both the high school and collegiate levels.

Pearson is the team's assistant head coach and also

coaches the offensive line and tight ends. The Florida native played collegiately at the University of Minnesota and has coached collegiately at the College of the Holy Cross, Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M in addition to a successful stint as a high school coach in Florida.

Pearson has been busy this offseason honing his craft as he also participated in the prestigious NFL-NCAA Coaches Academy in the spring of 2012. Pearson was one of only 30 coaches selected to network and learn from former NFL coaches, general managers and current NCAA head coaches.

NO TV?

For the first time in more than a decade, the Panthers aren't scheduled to make a national TV appearance within the SWAC's television rotation.

There remains the possibility the Panthers will pick up a TV appearance via regional networks as the season goes on. Despite the lack of TV, fans shouldn't worry PV's official online video service, Panthervision, will return for the fall and broadcast Prairie View A&M football home games.

NEXT UP?

Despite losing sack master **Adrian Hamilton**, the next defender ready to step in and extend the tradition of playing in the NFL is redshirt senior **Jarvis Wilson**.

Playing opposite Hamilton in 2011, Wilson accounted for 59 tackles, 11 tackles for loss and seven sacks. The Fort Worth, Texas native followed it up with an impressive junior pro day in the spring which put him on the NFL radar.

"Jarvis ran a better 40 (yard dash) time than (former defensive end and current Cleveland Brown) Quinton Spears and Adrian and right after, people started calling and inquiring about professional opportunities," said Northern. "We all think he'll be the next guy to step it up."

2012 SCHEDULE TO BE ROAD HEAVY AGAIN

The Panther football team will literally live out of their suitcases this fall once again as nine of the team's 11 games are away from campus. Last season, the Panthers stepped on a charter bus or plane eight times.

The first two contests in 2012 will take place in Houston and Dallas before a three-week out-of-state excursion. PV returns to Texas for the State Fair Classic on Oct. 6 before returning home for homecoming on Oct. 20. The second and final on-campus game of 2012 will occur on Nov. 3 against Alabama State.

2012 SEASON PREVIEW

PANTHERS SET OUT TO FINISH WHERE THEY STARTED AS THEY PREPARE FOR THEIR 2012 CAMPAIGN

PROJECTED STRENGTHS: Experience is on Prairie View A&M's side as they return 16 starters overall. The defensive line will be the strength of the defense with three starters back and a plethora of experienced reserves. The Panthers are young but talented at linebacker and they'll help carry the load as shoring up the secondary remains the biggest concern entering the season. Offensively, nearly everyone returns except two All-American offensive linemen but their backups appear ready to step in. Returning experience at quarterback, running back and wide receiver will be a plus as the Panthers didn't have anyone with significant experience at those positions this time last year.

EARLY QUESTION: Will the secondary rebound after a subpar 2011 campaign? Will defensive end **Jarvis Wilson** step in and pick up where **Adrian Hamilton** left off? How will the youth on offense respond after gaining on-the-job experience in 2011? How will the Panthers fare with a schedule that only features two home games?

TOP AWARDS CANDIDATES: **Jarvis Wilson** could emerge as a Buck Buchanan candidate while **Spencer Nelson** has a chance to become a dual threat at wideout and returner.

One game, several plays, the little things.

The phrase above can best describe the 2011 Prairie View A&M Panther football team as they finished just one game short of earning the program's second trip to the SWAC Championship Game. Under the guidance of the head coach **Heishma Northern**, the Panthers saw their entire season flash before their eyes as two costly losses at Blackshear Stadium proved to be the difference between playing football in December and watching it on TV.

"I think in a way you got to remind the players and coaches about it as it goes to show you that attention to detail can make a difference in the outcome of a ballgame and your season," said Northern. "You don't want to harp on it but you want them to learn and develop a sense of urgency that's needed to become a champion.

"I was still disappointed at not going to the SWAC Championship and some people still congratulated me on a good season but I was not satisfied as I want to change the culture here to the point where if we don't win the championship, then it's not a good season. Just beating Grambling State and Texas Southern doesn't define a season, you want to win non-conference games against good teams and win championships."

Back for his second season as the Panthers head coach, Northern learned a lot of things about his team and entire university in general as a first-year head coach. According to Northern, for a program to become successful, everyone must be on the same page from the top on down.

"I learned that it's way bigger than just the head coach in the grand scheme of things," said Northern. "It's about the equipment manager, athletic trainers, ath-



letic director, sports information staff, strength and conditioning and the players. We all have to be one and no one can be divided in any strength, shape or form."

Despite the setback, Northern had little time to think about last fall as the 2012 season began immediately after the last football game. In the spring, Northern went back to the basics and stressed things such as attention to detail, communication and fundamental football.

"I wanted to make sure our guys are doing things the way we wanted them done instead of doing things that's convenient for them," said Northern. "A lot of times, that leads to misunderstanding and poor play."

The Panthers were so young in 2011 that newcomers kept their name tags on longer than expected as the roster featured an abundance of true freshmen and red-shirt freshmen playing key roles entering the team's first game in Orlando, Fla. on Sept. 4, 2011. By the time the season concluded in November, the Panthers had an entirely different look as Northern and staff knew what needed to be worked on entering the upcoming year.

"Improving our rush defense is the top priority followed by improving the kicking game from the kicks to kickoff return units," stated Northern. "The kicking unit had some ups and downs as they looked brilliant at times but then they would miss a kick or give up a long kickoff. Those are the things we definitely have to improve on if we want to have a successful year."

OFFENSE

On offense, nine starters return to a unit which finished third in total offense amongst SWAC teams in the first season under offensive coordinator **Mark Orlando**. With the exception of losing two redshirt senior offensive linemen, the rest of the offense is back for another go-around as at times in 2011, the unit played like seasoned veterans but then would show its youth at key moments of the game.

"I feel good about our wide receivers as I think that's going to be a big strength for us," said Northern. "Tight end will be a concern for us as even though we have some guys who can catch the ball pretty well, we need a bigger guy who can set the edge and get us on the corner. I don't want to become predictable with what we're going to do when we insert a tight end in the game."

QUARTERBACKS

Prairie View A&M played musical chairs at quarterback last season as the Panthers went with the hot hand due to the fact that they had two freshmen in their first season of collegiate action along with a senior who was playing his first full season of football due to an injury the season before. As a result, three quarterbacks received an opportunity to start games last season with all of them entering at some point due to the team needing a spark.

With senior **Jonathan Troast** departing, sophomores **Jerry Lovelocke** and **Deantre Smiley** will battle for playing time. Both players bring something different to



the table as Smiley has shown the ability to run the ball while Lovelocke led the Panthers with 1,020 passing yards and 10 touchdowns. The duo will also be joined by newcomer **Chris Cayce**, who participated with the team during the spring and may have worked his way into the mix.

"We led the SWAC in rushing and that was surprising with two freshmen quarterbacks," said Northern. "I want to throw the ball more this year and take advantage of teams trying to crowd the box so they can take away the running game. We do not need the quarterbacks to have the strongest arms; we need them to become more accurate when we throw the ball in addition to making good decisions."

Northern said he would like to solidify the quarterback position early on and said Lovelocke has a slight edge entering camp.

"You want to have two capable quarterbacks because you don't know what's going to happen throughout the season," he said. "We're going to let them battle and see where it goes but at this time, it's Jerry's job to lose more than anything."

RUNNING BACK

Similar to the quarterbacks, the Panthers opened the previous season with two newcomers to the collegiate game in true freshman **Fred Anderson** and junior **Le'Darryae Groover**. The duo complemented each other well as they helped the Panthers lead the SWAC in rushing after combining for 1,059 yards and eight touchdowns. Sophomore **Courtney Brown** will also have an expanded role this season as he came on late in the season after rushing for 96 yards and two touchdowns.

"We need to work on pass protection and taking care of the ball at running back," said Northern. "If they can do a better job of making people miss in space instead of trying to run them over, we'll be fine."

Like quarterback, the Panthers don't plan on using any other runners at the position if they don't have to but Northern said **Darius Edwards**, who redshirted as a true freshman and has a lot of natural ability, may work his way into the rotation pending his performance in summer school.

FULLBACK

With the Panthers running the ball as well as they did in 2011, expectations will be even higher as lead blocker **Krys Watkins** returns along with three-year veteran **Winston Dossman**. Watkins, a senior who missed his first year due to an injury, did an exceptional job at the position last year and will be counted on to provide the same service in 2012.

"Krys did an outstanding job blocking and he can catch the ball out of the backfield as well," said Northern. "He'll hold everything down at that spot."

WIDE RECEIVER

Northern is excited about this unit for a variety of reasons as nearly every receiver who caught a pass in 2011, returns for 2012 a year older and wiser. In the team's spread attack, having an abundance of wide receivers is a plus which allows for a deep rotation.

Redshirt senior **Spencer Nelson** was the biggest beneficiary of Coach Orlando's offensive scheme as he led the Panthers with a career-high 53 receptions for 659 yards and five touchdowns. Outside receiver and sophomore **Greg Thurmond** finished second on the team with 24 receptions, 382 yards and four touchdowns followed



by fellow outside receiver and senior **Deandre Cooper's** 244 receiving yards on 23 receptions and three touchdowns. Sophomore **Gabe Dunlap** also opened a lot of eyes in the spring and should become a major contributor as he caught three receptions for 41 yards as a freshman.

"Last year was the first time our returnees played extensively while the freshmen were learning on the fly," said Northern. "We look forward to all of them learning from their experiences and stepping up this season to become playmakers. I expect three to four of those guys to have 30 to 40 receptions each so it won't allow defenses to focus on one receiver."

TIGHT END

The Panthers return two tight ends in senior **Dante' Pickett** and sophomore **Olatunde' Idowu**. Pickett, a fifth-year senior, has emerged as a solid blocker while Idowu caught two touchdown passes as a true freshman. Both players bring something different to the table but Northern has stated he needs another tight end that's slightly bigger than both for blocking purposes.

"Olatunde' catches the ball a little bit better than Pickett and runs better routes while Pickett can mix it up in the trenches a little bit better because of his size," said Northern. "I want to be balanced so I can move those

guys around and create mismatches. I want to avoid the scenario where teams know we're only going to throw it to Olatunde' and only run to Pickett's side."

OFFENSIVE LINE

Despite having only two returning starters to the offensive line in 2011, offensive line coach **Prince Pearson** has proven to get the best out of what he has as the Panthers ended up leading the SWAC in rushing last season as they averaged 174.4 yards per contest while also accounting for 17 rushing touchdowns. Even though three of the five linemen return from last season, two of the starters were fifth-year seniors who've earned some type of All-American and All-SWAC honor over their tenure.

"The main thing is we want the offensive line to work as a cohesive unit," said Northern. "We started a freshman at center last year and one at tackle so we were forced to play a lot of young guys at different spots due to injuries. I hope the experience those guys gained while filling in will draw the line closer together."

Redshirt sophomore **Tre Glover** has solidified himself as a starter at tackle while either redshirt freshman **Denzel Lewis** or redshirt junior **Aneus Ruiz** will battle it out for the other tackle spot opposite Glover. Redshirt senior **Langston Patterson** is entrenched at guard along with redshirt sophomore **Dillon Bonnet** returning at center. Along with tackle, a battle will ensue in the fall for the guard spot opposite Patterson as a group of youngsters will vie for the position.



DEFENSE

Seven starters return to a defensive unit that had several ups and downs like its offensive counterparts in 2011. The Panthers enter the 2012 season with tons of experience up front which should bode well as the defensive secondary continues to find its groove.

"Our pass rush will be the strength of the defense whether it comes from our defensive line or linebackers as we'll be able to get after the quarterback," said Northern. "Our weakness may still be in the secondary in terms of our safeties playing the way they're supposed to in man coverage and our linebackers against the pass. We'll have to keep people in second and third-and-long situations and with a year of experience for most of our secondary, we hope to utilize more of our packages at that point."

DEFENSIVE LINE

A new standard has been set by the Panthers' defensive line as it has been proven that solid play will get you noticed by the professional level. Of the three Panthers to earn NFL opportunities over the past four years, all have come from the defensive line in **Jermaine McGhee**, **Quinton Spears** and **Adrian Hamilton**.

Defensive line coaches **Miles Brandon** and **Gabe Northern** open the year with a big task as All-American

and SWAC All-Time sack leader **Adrian Hamilton** moves on to the NFL. As a senior in 2011, Hamilton burst on to the scene in a huge way with 20.5 sacks and kept opposing offensive coaches up all night scheming ways to keep him away from the quarterback.

Despite losing Hamilton, the next defender ready to step in and extend the tradition is redshirt senior **Jarvis Wilson**. Playing opposite Hamilton, Wilson accounted for 59 tackles, 11 tackles for loss and seven sacks. The Fort Worth, Texas native followed it up with an impressive junior pro day in the spring which put him on the NFL radar.

"Jarvis ran a better 40 (yard dash) time than Quinton and Adrian and right after, people started calling and inquiring about professional opportunities," said Northern. "We all think he'll be the next guy to step it up but we also have some young guys in **Adrian Middleton** and **Amir Smith** who'll be ready to play."

Smith, initially brought to Prairie View A&M to play quarterback before moving to the defensive backfield last season, fits in the mold of Spears as both came to Prairie View A&M to play offense but switched to defense. Northern said Smith is a player who'll give his all on the field and could become the same type of player as Spears or better due to the fact that he's bigger than Spears at this point in his career.

Inside, the Panthers will rely on veterans **Ryan Love** and **Dwayne Chappell** as the duo combined for 77 tackles, nine sacks and three tackles for loss. The interior line also receives a boost as **Deon Jones** and **Tyler Dickson** returns to the gridiron after missing the 2011 campaign.

"We should be able to go back to our normal rotation of eight to 10 guys on the defensive line," said Northern. "They'll substitute themselves when needed based on the pace of the ball game."

LINEBACKERS

The linebackers will be an intriguing unit to watch as they return several seasoned veterans along with some solid youngsters. However, the face of the unit could change overnight as the term "student-athlete" comes into play with one of their leading tacklers from 2011.

The unit will be manned by redshirt senior middle linebacker **Elton Holmes** and redshirt junior outside



linebacker **Raheem Cardwell**. Cardwell finished third on the team with 66 tackles while Holmes tallied 52 tackles and three tackles for loss. Redshirt junior **Marcus White** finished second on the team in tackles with 68 and 11.5 tackles for loss but is slated to attend the prestigious Prairie View A&M College of Nursing this fall which makes his status somewhat unclear as the College of Nursing is located off campus in Houston. Redshirt sophomore **Danny Brownell** is also expected to play a larger role in 2012 after a solid spring along with sophomore **Jerome Howard**, redshirt freshman **Brandon Medina** and redshirt sophomore **Vernon Chevis**.

"We expect Elton, Raheem and Danny to be the leaders of the group even though a couple of those guys have two years remaining," stated Northern. "Marcus will try to give it a go this fall in nursing school so we'll see how that plays out which means that we'll need Jerome, Brandon and Vernon to step up their play and become consistent on the field."

SECONDARY

A former safety at Southern University in the 1990s, no one was more disappointed with the play of the defensive backfield than Northern last season. An area of concern once again entering the season, Northern's goal

is to improve the unit as whole starting with the safeties as **Brian Medlock, Adrien Grant, Chris King** and **Terrence Mitchell** all return to the position a year wiser as Medlock finished fourth in tackles with 59 while breaking up four passes.

"We have to get the safeties to play smarter as there were times last fall where they wouldn't follow through with certain assignments," said Northern. "I want the safeties to be the leader of the defense along with the linebackers. At times last year, the safeties didn't communicate well across the board and get everyone on the same page as that's their main job."

At corner, All-American **Moses Ellis** has graduated and moved on along with fellow starter **JohnMark Henderson**. Northern said he'll begin the season with a cornerback by committee as he feels he has enough depth to utilize some additional packages he couldn't use last season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Northern stated he would like for his special teams, especially the kicking units, to become more consistent in 2012. Priority number one is to replace kickoff returner **Jermaine Waddy** as the senior earned All-SWAC honors at the position last fall.

"I'll look at **Spencer Nelson** to open the season at kick returner but I think we can use some of the younger guys we signed at the position as a spark back there. I can slide a freshman back there as it's easy to do because all you have to do is catch the ball and run unlike the critical spacing, instincts and judgment needed to return punts. Spencer most likely will open as the punt returner also as he has some experience at the position."

At punter, sophomore **Travis Jatzlau** returns to the fold after averaging 39.2 yards per punt last season, including 16 punts placed inside the 20-yard line along with a 73 yarder. Redshirt sophomore **Chris Barrick** will assume the placekicking duties once again and looks to bounce back as his impressive start to the 2011 season gave way to a shaky finish at the end.

"Travis did an outstanding job last year and he knows what needs to be done in order to get better," said Northern. "Chris had an up-and-down season last year as he made some game-winning kicks and then struggled with some kicks. We have to get him more consistent to

where his confidence stays up to where if he misses a kick, just have him worry about the next one and not look back. I think all kickers go through that and I hope that's something he never has to go through again while at Prairie View."

COACHING STAFF

In what has become a consistent theme at Prairie View A&M, the Panthers return their entire coaching staff from the previous season which should bode well with familiarity as when Northern took over in December of 2010, five coaches were brought in.

"It should help as everyone should know each other's tendencies from the coaches themselves to the players," he said. "The coaches know how their how their players will react at practice, handle success and adversity. As for myself, my job is to also coach the coaches as well as the players.

"It's good to have everyone back but I don't want our ideas to become stale. We have three guys going to work at NFL Training Camps this summer and I would like them to come back with some things they learned and apply them to our methods which could cause problems for other teams."

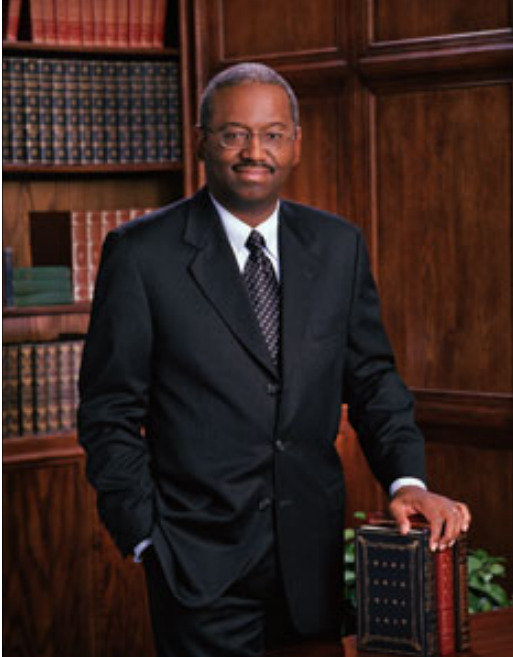
SCHEDULE

The 2012 Panther football schedule is road heavy as only two of the 11 scheduled games are on-campus this fall. Prairie View A&M will play its usual nine-game SWAC schedule in addition to two road non-conference games against 2011 FCS National Champion North Dakota State and Southland Conference member Lamar. No stranger to a lack of home contests over the years, Northern will formulate a new practice plan to counter the side effects of the road.

"We'll do things differently this year as I think the road wore down the team last year towards the end of the season," he said. "We may have a few more practices in limited pads than traditional practices in full pads in order to maintain energy. Hopefully next year, we'll be able to have more games back at home or locally as being on the road five to six weeks at a time isn't conducive to having a good football team consistently."

Dr. George C. Wright, noted African-American scholar, is the President of Prairie View A&M University, the second oldest public institution of higher education in Texas. Offering baccalaureate, master's and doctoral degrees through nine colleges and schools, Dr. Wright now leads the 130-year old HBCU with an established reputation for producing thousands of African American engineers, nurses and educators. A member of the Texas A&M University System, the University is dedicated to fulfilling its land-grant mission of achieving excellence in teaching, research and service.

A native of Lexington, Kentucky, Dr. Wright received his bachelor's and master's degrees in history from the University of Kentucky and his doctorate in history from Duke University. In 2004, Dr. Wright was awarded an honorary doctorate of letters from the University of Kentucky.

His teaching experience began in 1977 as an assistant professor at the University of Kentucky. In 1980, he began teaching at the University of Texas at Austin where he would eventually become a full professor and the holder of the Mastin Gentry White Professorship of Southern History. After his first year at UT, he was voted one of the 10 best faculty every year on the annual list of the 10 Best and 10 Worst of 5,000 faculty. He received the top teaching award in both the Colleges

of Arts and Sciences, the Jean Holloway Award for Teaching Excellence, and the top teaching award for the entire university, Lillian and Tom B. Rhodes Centennial Teaching Fellow, which garnered a \$10,000 prize. In 1993, he joined the faculty at Duke University as vice provost for undergraduate programs, director of the Afro-American studies program and held the William R. Kenan, Jr., Chair in American history.

Since 1986, Dr. Wright has held a number of administrative positions and prior to joining the Prairie View A&M University family, Dr. Wright was Provost and Executive Vice-President for academic affairs at the University of Texas at Arlington.

To his credit, Dr. Wright has authored three books on race relations and numerous scholarly publications and been the recipient of numerous fellowships, grants and awards. The Andrew W. Mellon Faculty Fellowship earned him a year at Harvard University to conduct research.

Active in his community, Dr. Wright has served on numerous civic boards and is a current member of the University of Kentucky College of Arts and Sciences Advisory Board. He is married to Valerie Ellison Wright, a journalist, and together they had two children, Rebecca Ellison Wright, who passed away in March, 2004, and Benjamin, who attends the University of Texas at San Antonio.

PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC DIRECTOR FRED WASHINGTON



Fred E. Washington was officially named Director of Athletics at Prairie View A&M University in February of 2009. An 18-year veteran of Prairie View A&M and the State of Texas, Washington also serves as Vice President of Administration and Auxiliary Services.

As the Vice President of Administration and Auxiliary Services, Washington has the responsibility for planning, implementation, management, and operations of the following functional units:

- Athletics
- Housing and Residence Life
- The Memorial Student Center
- Health Center Operations
- University Police
- Farrell Hall Laundry Operation
- University Student I.D. Program
- Parking Management
- Campus Dining and Food Service
- KPVA Radio Station

Washington is coming off a history-making 2011-12 campaign as Prairie View A&M won the SWAC Commissioner's Cup for the first time in university history as the cup marks the top overall athletic program in the Southwestern Athletic Conference. The department also won the Sadie Magee/Barbara Jacket Award and C.D. Henry Award which is awarded to the top women's and men's programs in the conference.

Individually, Prairie View A&M won three SWAC Championships in baseball, bowling and women's basketball and captured the SWAC Western Division title in bowling and volleyball for the second consecutive year. The women's basketball SWAC Tournament Championship also marked the second straight tourney title for the team and second NCAA Appearance under Washington's watch while the baseball program made its first NCAA regional trip with Washington as athletic director.

Outside of the gridiron and inside the classroom, Prairie View A&M's academic success has risen to the same level of its athletic counterparts under Washington.

Prairie View A&M led the way with 119 student-athletes earning a spot on the All-SWAC Academic Team, which honors student-athletes with GPAs of 3.0 or higher. The women's soccer team was recognized by the National Soccer Coaches Association for its hard work in the classroom as they posted a cumulative grade point average over 3.0 while the bowling team had two student-athletes earn NTCA All-Academic honors.

In 2010-11 Prairie View A&M finished third overall in the 2010-11 SWAC Commissioner Cup standings and had two female student-athletes selected as the SWAC's Women of the Year.

Faced with the departure of women's basketball coach Cynthia Cooper-Dyke in May of 2010, Washington elevated assistant coach Toyelle Wilson to the head position and quickly reaped the rewards as Wilson guided the Lady Panthers to their third-ever NCAA Tournament Appearance after winning the 2011 SWAC Tournament Championship. The Prairie View A&M Lady Panther bowling program also had another stellar season by capturing their first-ever division crown and second consecutive runner-up appearance in the SWAC Championship. On the diamond, the Panther baseball team turned the corner and returned to the SWAC Tournament for the first time since 2008 while the football posted its fourth consecutive winning season coupled with several men's track performers earning a spot at the NCAA Regionals.

In 2009-10, the athletic program earned the Barbara Jacket/Sadie Magee Award as the top overall women's sports program in the Southwestern Athletic Conference for only the second time in school history.

Also during that year, the women's athletic programs at Prairie View boasted several solid performances highlighted by second place finishes in women's basketball, bowling, soccer and outdoor track and field.

On the men's side, the football program recorded its first SWAC Championship since 1964 in 2009 while the tennis team recorded its 19th SWAC Championship and second-ever NCAA Championship appearance. In addition, the men's basketball team returned to the SWAC Tournament for the second consecutive season which hasn't happened since 2003.

In his first year at the helm, Prairie View A&M continued to excel in the athletic arena as the Panther football team finished with their best season since 1964 following a 9-1 mark. On the hardwood, the Prairie View A&M Lady Panther basketball team won their third straight SWAC Regular Season Championship and also made their second-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament after winning the SWAC Tournament Championship for the second time in school history. Prairie View's men's basketball program also rebounded during the 2008-09 season as they put together their best season since 2002-2003 after recording a third-place finish in the SWAC and their first SWAC Tournament win in six years. In addition, the record also marked the program's first winning season in six years and only the second time since 1978-79.

Outside of the athletic arena, the athletic department has continued to maintain strong relationships with its corporate supporters as evident with sponsorships from companies such nationally recognized companies such as State Farm, Texas Farm Bureau, ATT Yellow Pages and Marriot. Washington was also instrumental in developing the prototype for the proposed Prairie View A&M Sports Complex in addition to committing more resources for the department's academic initiatives. The Department of Athletics was among 35 universities nationally in April of 2009 to receive a 10-year NCAA Certification. In addition, Washington has created a strong bond between Prairie View and the surrounding community with the implementation of the Panther Prowl Initiative which encourages PVAMU student-athletes and staff to become involved in the community.

Washington has worn several hats throughout 18-year career at Prairie View A&M. On July 1, 2005, he was appointed to his current position of Vice President of Administration and Auxiliary Services by The Texas A&M University System Board of Regents. Prior to this appointment, he was appointed as Associate Vice President for Finance and Administration by Mr. Dan Williams following a 10-month deployment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in the country of Afghanistan. Washington has also served eight years as the Director of Auxiliary Services, two years as the Business Manager for Auxiliary Support Services and two years as Staff Accountant for Restricted Funds for Prairie View A&M.

Washington also serves as a Major in the United States Army Reserve and is in his 20th year of service in that regard. As a commissioned officer, Washington has served in several leadership positions throughout his career. He is currently serving as a senior trainer for the 75th Division in Houston. Prior to that, Washington spent five years as the senior logistician for the 373 Combat Service Support Battalion of Beaumont, Texas, two years as a supply and services officer, four years as a unit commander two years as an executive officer (XO) responsible for all unit administrative operations and three (3) years as a platoon leader. Washington has also attended the Army Logistics Management College (ALMAC) and has completed the requirements for three certifications in logistics management.

Washington has earned two degrees from Prairie View A&M University: Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting, 1992 and Master of Business Administration in Management, 1996

Washington and his wife Alvina have four children, Andrew, Elysia, Matthew and Maegan. The family resides in Northwest Houston.

PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH HEISHMA NORTHERN

Heishma Northern was named the 31st head coach in university history on Dec. 13, 2010. No stranger to the Southwestern Athletic Conference, Northern begins his 16th season on the collegiate level and eighth season at Prairie View A&M.

In his first season as head coach for the Panthers, Northern led one of the youngest teams in the Southwestern Athletic Conference to within one game of earning a SWAC Championship berth as Prairie View A&M finished tied for second in the SWAC's Western Division. As a team, the Panthers placed five players on the 2011 All-SWAC Team, led the league in rush offense with 174.8 yards per game and finished with the third-best offensive unit in the SWAC. Defensively, Northern's defensive background had a huge impact on the field as the Panthers led the SWAC with 45 sacks. Prairie View A&M also displayed sound discipline on the gridiron as they committed the fewest amount of penalties in the SWAC.

As a result of the team's defensive prowess, defensive end **Adrian Hamilton** emerged as one of the top defenders in the nation as he set the SWAC and Prairie View A&M all-time sack record with 20.5 sacks en route to earning 2011 co-SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors and a third-place finish in the 2011 Buck Buchanan Award voting, which is awarded to the top defender on the Football Championship Subdivision level. Prairie View A&M's fifth consecutive consensus AP All-American, Hamilton also played in two postseason all-star games in addition to becoming the second straight Panther defensive lineman to sign a NFL contract as he inked with the Dallas Cowboys.

In addition to Hamilton's accomplishments, several other Panthers had impressive seasons under Northern as running back/kick returner **Jermaine Waddy** led the SWAC in all-purpose yards while cornerback Moses Ellis finished as the league's top punt returner.

Prior to becoming head coach, Northern was an award-winning defensive coordinator for six seasons at Prairie View A&M. Under his watch, the Panther defense rose to become one of the top units in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Ranks.

For the fourth straight season, Northern's defense produced another All-American following the 2010 campaign as cornerback **Moses Ellis** led the nation in interceptions with eight and defended 22 passes en route to earning All-American and All-SWAC honors. As a unit, the Panthers finished second in pass defense amongst SWAC foes as they only yielded 164.6 yards per contest. As a result, four members of the Panther defense earned All-SWAC honors in Ellis (first team), defensive lineman **Quinton Spears** (first), free safety **Chris Adingupu** (second) and middle linebacker **Max Sencherey** (second).



Despite losing six key starters and a two-time All-American from the previous year, Prairie View's defensive unit was instrumental during the team's historic run to the SWAC Championship in 2009 as the unit led the SWAC in scoring defense with 16.6 points per outing and pass defense efficiency (101.7). The Panthers finished the 2009 season ranked fifth in total defense and produced its second consecutive All-American in defensive back **Anthony Beck** along with having three All-SWAC members in Beck, Spears and Adingupu. In addition, Northern's unit recorded two shutouts on the season and held four teams to 74 yards or less on the ground.

In 2008, the Panther defense set the tone for the team's 9-1 record as they concluded the year ranked second nationally in scoring defense, third in total defense, third in rush defense and seventh in pass efficiency defense. Prairie View also made history and recorded two shutouts for the first time since the 1966 season.

As a result of Prairie View's defensive prowess, Northern earned national acclaim and was selected as FootballScoop.com's 2008 Division I-AA Coordinator of the Year. Individually, linebacker **Zach East** closed out his career as a two-time All-American while Beck and Spears earned First and

Second Team All-SWAC Honors, respectively.

During the 2007 season, Northern's defense played a key role in helping the Panthers clinch their first winning season in four decades as they finished atop the SWAC in scoring and red zone defense along with a third-place total defense ranking. A total of three starters earned All-SWAC honors led by East earning All-American and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year Honors.

One year removed from finishing sixth in total defense among SWAC foes, Northern made his mark in his second year at Prairie View during the 2006 season after fielding the top-ranked defensive unit in the conference. Led by first team All-SWAC defensive end and future NFL free agent signee **Jermaine McGhee**, the Panthers set a school record for fewest yards rushing by an opponent after holding Edward Waters College to -35 yards. For his hard work on the gridiron after the season, Northern was one of 26 coaches from across the nation invited to attend the NCAA Expert Coaches Academy in Miami, Fla.

Prior to his tenure at Prairie View, Northern spent seven seasons at Grambling State University in a variety of capacities.

Initially brought to GSU to serve as running backs coach, Northern made a seamless transition to coaching defensive backs in 2001 as his unit ranked ninth nationally in interceptions en route to GSU's second-straight SWAC Championship. During the 2002 season, which marked Grambling's third consecutive SWAC title, Northern's group improved on the interception mark as they ranked fourth nationally.

In 2003, Northern assumed the role of interim defensive coordinator and immediately made his impact felt as the Tiger defense finished the year ranked third nationally against the run in Division I-AA. In the SWAC, the Tigers finished

second in rushing, third in scoring defense, fourth in opponent third down percentage, fourth in turnover margin and fifth in sacks.

Over the course of his coaching career, Northern has had several of his former players enter the professional football realm gaining experience with the NFL, World and Arena Football Leagues. In addition, several of his pupils have received an opportunity to coach on the collegiate level.

A 1996 mathematics education graduate of Southern University, Northern began his coaching career on the high school level at Glen Oaks High School in Baton Rouge, La. where he coached girl's basketball and baseball. He then moved on to Morehouse College in Atlanta, Ga. serving as the team's running backs coach and special teams coordinator in 1997 under former head coach, Super Bowl MVP and current Grambling State head coach **Doug Williams**.

A student of the game of football, Northern was one of only 15 coaches from across the nation selected to participate in the prestigious NCAA Champions Forum during June of 2010. He has also completed a training camp internship with the Oakland Raiders of the National Football League in the summer of 2009.

Northern, who also holds a master's degree in Sports Administration from Grambling State, is the oldest of three siblings and is married to the former **Paula Duell** of Baton Rouge, La. Together, they have two children, **Adam** (5) and **Brooke** (1).

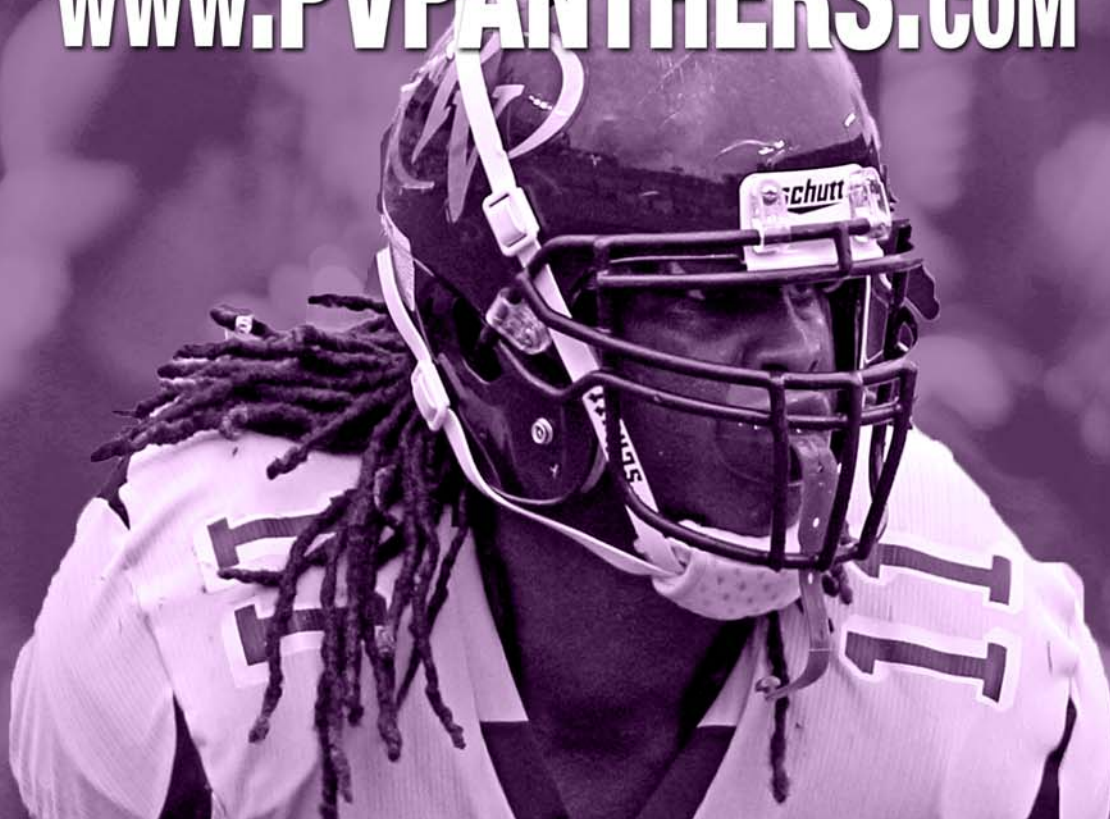
