THE GAME

PANTHERS TO SEEK THIRD STRAIGHT WIN

The Prairie View A&M Panthers return to the Port City to face SWAC West rival Southern University in a big divisional showdown on Saturday afternoon at Independence Stadium. Both Prairie View A&M and Southern enter this weekend's game chasing divisional foe Arkansas-Pine Bluff as UAPB has a two-game lead over both teams in the SWAC West standings. With the margin for error extremely slim, today's game is for the marbles as a loss by either team will basically eliminate them from the championship race.

After a rough start in the month of September, Prairie View A&M has remained undefeated in October as they enter today's game on a two-game winning streak to climb back into the title hunt. Needing to win out in order to have an opportunity for a SWAC crown, the Panthers are beginning to peak at the right time as they're explosive on offense at this point while the defense has had two solid games. In addition to the action on the gridiron, the sideline battle will be intriguing as PV head coach **Heishma Northern** grew up in Baton Rouge, La., graduated and played collegiately at Southern. PV offensive coordinator **Mark Orlando** was a longtime coordinator for the Jaguars while cornerbacks coach **Raasaan Haralson** also played and graduated from Southern.

ABOUT THE SOUTHERN JAGUATS

A far cry from their dominant SWAC Championship teams of the 1990s and early 2000s, the Southern Jaguars are in the midst of a major transition across the board from the academic side to the athletic side.

Since releasing longtime coach **Pete Richardson** in 2009, the Jaguars have struggled tremendously with a 9-20 record since. Earlier this season, the university released Richardson's predecessor, **Stump Mitchell**, after the second game of the season and appointed assistant **Dawson Odums** as the interim

Odums had immediate success with a big win over Jackson State and followed it up with a win over Florida A&M. However, the momentum has slowed as SU has dropped two of its past three games which has bumped them into a second-place tie with Prairie View A&M. SU is coming off a devastating home loss to Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Saturday, Oct. 20.

Quarterback **Dray Joseph** leads the Jags offensively as he tops the SWAC with 201.9 passing yards per game and has thrown for 11 touchdowns. He has totaled 1,413 yards passing and completed 56 percent of his passes. Wide receiver **Lee Doss** is Joseph's favorite target with 36 receptions. Defensively, defensive back **Virgil Williams** is the top tackler with 44 stops and four tackles for losses.

Christopher Barrick kicked a 19-yard field goal with 10 seconds remaining to give Prairie View A&M a 23-20 victory over Southern University in a Southwestern Athletic Conference game Saturday night.

The game-winning kick was the second this season for Barrick, whose 36-yarder gave the Panthers (4-2, 4-1) a 37-34 win over Texas Southern on Sept. 10. It also gave first-year coach **Heishma Northern** a victory over his alma mater.

Barrick's kick against the Jaguars (2-4, 2-2) capped a 12-play, 41-yard drive that consumed 5:13 and featured six carries by **Le'Darryae Groover** and four by **Fred Anderson**.

Southern had tied the game 20-20 on a 38-yard interception return

by **Anthony Balancier** with 19 seconds left in the third quarter.

Prairie View also got a touch-down on an interception return, going ahead 14-7 in the second quarter when **Moses Ellis** ran one back.

THE LAST TIME

Prairie View has won four straight over Southern and has its longest winning streak over the Jaguars since the series began in the 1930s.

Also, the last time a first-year head coach at Southern defeated Prairie View A&M took place in 1993 as **Pete Richardson** defeated the Panthers 46-6.

BEEN HERE BEFORE

This isn't Prairie View's first rodeo in the city of Shreveport as the Panthers prepare for their third straight contest in the city and third meeting against the Jaguars in the Port City.

Southern defeated Prairie View 62-7 in 2003, before PV evened the Shreveport series record at 1-1 with a 30-16 win in 2010. Both teams featured different head coaches each time they played in Shreveport.

Last year, PV played Jackson State in the second annual Shreveport Classic.

AVOIDING HISTORY

Prairie View A&M has reentered into treacherous waters the program worked tirelessly to navigate out of over the past few decades.

The Panthers are currently 2-5 on the season and 2-3 in league play after picking up their first two wins in October.

The last time the Panthers had a losing record this late in the year occurred in 2006 as the team finished 3-7.

REUNION TIME

Saturday's contest in Shreveport will feature an assortment of storylines headlined by PV head coach **Heishma Northern** playing his alma mater.

A 1996 mathematics education graduate of Southern University, Northern is a Baton Rouge native and former player at Southern under **Marino Casem** and **Pete Richardson**. He was a finalist for their head coaching position in 2009 and still has tons of family living in the area.

Northern's college teammate, cornerbacks coach **Raasaan Haralson**, played defensive back at Southern and won a pair of Heritage Bowls in 1993 and 1995. A Baton Rouge native, Haralson also coached at LSU and Tennessee.

Also returning to his home state is defensive line and special teams assistant **Gabe Northern**, Heishma's younger brother. Gabe attended LSU and had a standout football career there before playing several years in the NFL.

Lastly, offensive coordinator **Mark Orlando** returns to the state of Louisiana to face his old school.

From 1993 to 2001, the Jaguars were the envy of Division I-AA, the SWAC and Black College Football as Orlando helped Southern compile five SWAC Championships and four HBCU National Championships. Offensively, the Jaguars ranked amongst the nations best as three of Southern's offensive career record holders occurred under his watch in quarterback **Bryant Lee**, running back **Steve Wofford** and wide receiver **Michael Hayes**.

Orlando returned to SU in 2004 and picked up where he left off as quarterback Lee flourished under Orlando's watch. Lee concluded his career at Southern as the school's all-time leader in passing yardage and touchdowns while wide receiver **Juamorris Stewart** burst on to the scene with a monster senior campaign that saw him top the 1,000-yard mark in receiving following the 2009 season.

RUN, RUN, RUN

The Panthers led the SWAC in rushing last fall with 174.4 yards per outing and 17 rushing touchdowns.

The team was over the 200-yard mark per game recently but dropped to an average of 185.3 yards with 12 touchdowns on the ground.

Sophomore running back **Fred Anderson** leads the team in rushing with 59 yards per game and two touchdowns while fellow sophomore **Courtney Brown** follows with 55.1 yards per game. Both Brown and Anderson posted 100-yard games in the month of October.

DO A LITTLE OF ALL

Freshman running back **Johnta' Hebert** has emerged as a dual threat for the Panthers with 109.3 all-purpose yards per outing. Hebert is also the team's primary kick returner with 19.1 yards per return and the holder of the team's lone kickoff return for a score this year.

Against Grambling State two weeks ago, Hebert took a kickoff to the house for the first time as a Panther as he ran back a 75-yard kickoff return on the game's opening play. Hebert also caught a 41-yard pass and scored his first career receiving touchdown in the same game.

PLEASE PUNT IT TO ME

Redshirt senior wideout **Spencer Nelson** is having a career year as a punt returner as he ranks fourth nationally with 17.5 yards per punt return. Nelson has fielded eight punts in 2012 for a total of 140 yards with a long run of 46 yards.

As a team, Prairie View A&M ranks eighth nationally in punt returns.

A standout receiver, Nelson has also compiled 365 yards on 34 receptions.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Playing wide receiver in offensive coordinator **Mark Orlando's** offense has to be exciting as a total of 15 players have caught a pass this fall.

Spencer Nelson leads the way with 34 receptions while **Deandre Cooper** follows with 21.

TWICE IS NICE

Entering the 2012 season, head coach **Heishma Northern** preferred to settle on one quarterback this season after playing three quarterbacks in 2011.

Sophomore **De'Auntre Smiley** had the opportunity to solidify the position early after beating out sophomore **Jerry Lovelocke**, who was PV's leading passer in 2011.

Smiley had a solid debut on Sept. 1 with 186 yards on 13-of-20 passing. Lovelocke entered late in the second half and led the Panthers on a game-tying, 80-yard touchdown drive.

Smiley played the entire game against Lamar on Sept. 8 and every play except the final few in the fourth quarter loss against Alabama A&M on Sept. 15.

With Smiley out beginning on Sept. 22, Lovelocke struggled in his first two starts but returned to his old form versus Grambling State with a 199-yard passing performance on 19-of-26 passing.

Smiley returned to action on Oct. 20 versus Alcorn State and burst on to the scene after being out for more than a month. The Lufkin, Texas native was named SWAC Player of the Week after passing for 251 yards on 16-of-20 passing with four touchdowns and 30 rushing yards.

TURNING THE CORNER?

The Panther defense has had its fair share of struggles this fall as they rank ninth in total defense amongst SWAC foes. However, the defense may have turned a corner this month as they allowed a season-low 369 yards versus Alcorn State on Oct. 20 and 14 points to Grambling State on Oct. 6.

ROAD WARRIORS ONCE AGAIN

The Panthers will live out their suitcases once again this season as they'll play only two games on campus. The Panthers have nine games in which they'll pack their suitcases this season and will be the designated home team in four of the nine games.

After spending the 2009 season as an equipment manager, Cooper received medical clearance in 2010 to return to the field and spent the season playing special teams. Cooper was moved to wide receiver in the spring of 2011 and has been a starter ever since.

RECORD BREAKERS

Very few teams in the SWAC have as many record breakers on its coaching staff as Prairie View A&M.

Running backs coach **Brian Morgan** name is etched in the SWAC and national recordbooks as he's the all-time leading scorer amongst SWAC kickers and the career record holder with 50 field goals and single season field goal leader with 18. He also led Division I-AA following the 2001 campaign with 18 field goals and finished as the I-AA all-time leader with 197 extra points.

Graduate assistant **Clyde Edwards** was one of the most productive wide receivers in Grambling State history as he holds the school record for career touchdown receptions, receiving yards and the school single season record for touchdown receptions.

Graduate assistant **Brady Faggard** helped rewrite PV's recordbooks as Faggard holds the school record for field goals made with 19 during his four-year career and also holds the school single-season record with 35 extra points made in 2009.

ROAD TO THE NFL

Two Panthers were in NFL camps this summer in defensive ends **Quinton Spears** and **Adrian Hamilton**.

Spears was recently released by the Cleveland Browns while Hamilton is with the Baltimore Ravens after spending camp with the Dallas Cowboys.

Defensive end **Jarvis Wilson** has the potential to become the next with a strong season as he's attracting NFL interest.

PV COACHING TRIO SPENDS SUMMER AT NFL TRAINING CAMPS

A trio of Prairie View A&M coaches will rub elbows with some of the top athletes and coaches in their profession as defensive line assistant **Gabe Northern**, assistant head/offensive line coach **Prince Pearson** and safeties coach **Bubba McDowell** interned with NFL organizations during their respective training camps.

A second round draft pick of the Buffalo Bills in 1996, Northern is a five-

year NFL veteran who has spent time with the Bills, Pittsburgh Steelers and Minnesota Vikings. A graduate of LSU, Northern has coached on both the high school and collegiate levels.

Pearson is the team's assistant head coach and also coaches the offensive line and tight ends. The Florida native played collegiately at the University of Minnesota and has coached collegiately at the College of the Holy Cross, Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M in addition to a successful stint as a high school coach in Florida.

Pearson was busy this offseason honing his craft as he also participated in the prestigious NFL-NCAA Coaches Academy in the spring of 2012. Pearson was one of only 30 coaches selected to network and learn from former NFL coaches, general managers and current NCAA head coaches.

McDowell, who's in his second year on the Prairie View A&M football coaching staff, will have somewhat of a homecoming as he'll intern with the Tennessee Titans. McDowell was an NFL All-Pro and fan favorite with the Houston Oilers throughout his six-year career in Houston after graduating from the University of Miami. The Oilers moved to the state of Tennessee in 1997 before assuming its current mascot in 1999. This marks the fourth fellowship for McDowell as he interned with the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins and Houston Texans.

PANTHERS ON THE TUBE

This fall, the Panthers made history as they were the first SWAC program to have a live game on the newly-created Comcast SportsNet Houston.

Last weekend's homecoming contest versus Alcorn State was be televised live on campus. The game was shown live across the south on Comcast affiliates in Louisiana (Shreveport, Monroe, Houma, La Place) and Arkansas (Little Rock).

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH HEISHMA NORTHERN

Heishma Northern was named the 31st head coach in university history on Dec. 13, 2010. No stranger to the Southwestern Athletic Conference, Northern begins his 16th season on the collegiate level and eighth season at Prairie View A&M.

In his first season as head coach for the Panthers, Northern led one of the youngest teams in the Southwestern Athletic Conference to within one game of earning a SWAC Championship berth as Prairie View A&M finished tied for second in the SWAC's Western Division. As a team, the Panthers placed five players on the 2011 All-SWAC Team, led the league in rush offense with 174.8 yards per game and finished with the third-best offensive unit in the SWAC. Defensively, Northern's defensive background had a huge impact on the field as the Panthers led the SWAC with 45 sacks. Prairie View A&M also displayed sound discipline on the gridiron as they committed the fewest amount of penalties in the SWAC.

As a result of the team's defensive prowess, defensive end Adrian Hamilton emerged as one of the top defenders in the nation as he set the SWAC and Prairie View A&M single season sack record with 20.5 sacks en route to earning 2011 co-SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors and a third-place finish in the 2011 Buck Buchanan Award voting, which is awarded to the top defender on the Football Championship Subdivision level. Prairie View A&M's fifth consecutive consensus AP All-American, Hamilton also played in two postseason all-star games in addition to becoming the second straight Panther defensive lineman to sign a NFL contract as he inked with the Dallas Cowboys.

In addition to Hamilton's accomplishments, several other Panthers had impressive seasons under Northern as running back/kick returner Jermaine Waddy led the SWAC in all-purpose yards while cornerback Moses Ellis finished as the league's top punt returner.

Prior to becoming head coach, Northern was an award-winning defensive coordinator for six seasons at Prairie View A&M. Under his watch, the Panther defense rose to become one of the top units in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Ranks.

For the fourth straight season, Northern's defense produced another All-American following the 2010 campaign as cornerback Moses Ellis led the nation in interceptions with eight and defended 22 passes en route to earning All-American and All-SWAC honors. As a unit, the Panthers finished second in pass defense amongst SWAC foes as they only yielded 164.6 yards per contest. As a result, four members of the Panther defense earned All-SWAC honors in Ellis (first team), defensive lineman Quinton Spears (first), free safety Chris Adingupu (second) and middle linebacker Max Sencherey (second).

Despite losing six key starters and a two-time All-American from the previous year, Prairie View's defensive unit was instrumental during the team's historic run to the SWAC Championship in 2009 as the unit led the SWAC in scoring defense with 16.6 points per outing and pass defense efficiency (101.7). The Panthers finished the 2009 season ranked fifth in total defense and produced its second consecutive All-American in defensive back Anthony Beck along with having three All-SWAC members in Beck, Spears and Adingupu. In addition, Northern's unit recorded two shutouts on the season and held four teams to 74 yards or less on the ground.

In 2008, the Panther defense set the tone for the team's 9-1 record as they concluded the year ranked second nationally in scoring defense, third in total defense, third in rush defense and seventh in pass efficiency defense. Prairie View also made history and recorded two shutouts for the first time since the 1966 season.

As a result of Prairie View's defensive prowess, Northern earned national acclaim and was selected as FootballScoop.com's 2008 Division I-AA Coordinator of the Year. Individually, linebacker Zach East closed out his career as a two-time All-American while Beck and Spears earned First and Second Team All-SWAC Honors, respectively.

During the 2007 season, Northern's defense played a key role in helping the Panthers clinch their first winning season in four decades as they finished atop the SWAC in scoring and red zone defense along with a third-place total defense ranking. A total of three starters earned All-SWAC honors led by East earning All-American and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year Honors.

One year removed from finishing sixth in total defense among SWAC foes, Northern made his mark in his second year at Prairie View during the 2006 season after fielding the top-ranked defensive unit in the conference. Led by first team All-SWAC defensive end and future NFL free agent signee Jermaine McGhee, the Panthers set a school record for fewest yards rushing by an opponent after holding Edward Waters College to -35 yards. For his hard work on the gridiron after the season, Northern was one of 26 coaches from across the nation invited to attend the NCAA Expert Coaches Academy in Miami, Fla.

Prior to his tenure at Prairie View, Northern spent seven seasons at Grambling State University in a variety of capacities.

Initially brought to GSU to serve as running backs coach, Northern made a seamless transition to coaching defensive backs in 2001 as his unit ranked ninth nationally in interceptions en route to GSU's second-straight SWAC Championship. During the 2002 season, which marked Grambling's third consecutive SWAC title, Northern's group improved on the interception mark as they ranked fourth nationally.

In 2003, Northern assumed the role of interim defensive coordinator and immediately made his impact felt as the Tiger defense finished the year ranked third nationally against the run in Division I-AA. In the SWAC, the Tigers finished second in rushing, third in scoring defense, fourth in opponent third down percentage, fourth in turnover margin and fifth in sacks.

Over the course of his coaching career, Northern has had several of his former players enter the professional football realm gaining experience with the NFL, World and Arena Football Leagues. In addition, several of his pupils have received an opportunity to coach on the collegiate level.

A 1996 mathematics education graduate of Southern University, Northern began his coaching career on the high school level at Glen Oaks High School in Baton Rouge, La. where he coached girl's basketball and baseball. He then moved on to Morehouse College in Atlanta, Ga. serving as the team's running backs coach and special teams coordinator in 1997 under former head coach, Super Bowl MVP and current Grambling State head coach Doug Williams.

A student of the game of football, Northern was one of only 15 coaches from across the nation selected to participate in the prestigious NCAA Champions Forum during June of 2010. He has also completed a training camp internship with the Oakland Raiders of the National Football League in the summer of 2009.

Northern, who also holds a master's degree in Sports Administration from Grambling State, is the oldest of three siblings and is married to the former Paula Duell of Baton Rouge, La. Together, they have two children, Adam (5) and Brooke (1).
